**10. Executive Director Report:**

- A. Directives – The January Board meeting Directives have been completed.
- B. Fiscal Report – Testimony on the budget bill provisions for the OVMLB before the House Finance & Appropriations Subcommittee on Agriculture and Development was provided on February 28, 2013. A copy of the appropriation in HB 59 (Budget Bill) was provided. A representative from the Governor’s office requested that information regarding the tax reform impact on small businesses be sent out to the OVMLB listserv which was completed with the Governor’s documents.
- C. Rule Development – The board members were provided multiple documents and a synopsis of other state laws related to vaccination clinics and home veterinary visits. The Board members were asked to review Rule 4741-1-03 OAC as to the requirements for stationary facilities and Rule 4741-1-08 OAC for mobile facilities as a starting point. Both of these rules are up for their five year review in 2014. The Board members are also reviewing the AAVSB’s Practice Act Model in the development of rules. The Board members expressed that the new rule should also include wellness clinics.
- D. Board Appointments – The Board appointments for 2013 are complete. Dr. Tim Kolb, Dr. Rebecca Salinger, and Renee Jessen, RVT have accepted the Governor’s reappointment. Mr. John Brandt of Westerville has been appointed to the public member position for a term ending December 31, 2015. Ms. Stir thanked the appointees for their willingness to serve on the board.
- E. Wellness Policy – The Dept. of Administrative Services has developed an “Employee Health and Wellness Policy” for which each agency must abide. The policy requires the appointment of a Wellness Ambassador who develops an Agency wellness plan, provides quarterly updates, schedules and promotes wellness-related events, and attends quarterly statewide meetings. Due to the OVMLB having less than 50 employees, DAS will assume wellness programming and event coordination.

### **Open Forum:**

3. Dr. Brucchieri shall inform the Board within 48 hours of any change in employment or supervising veterinarian;
4. Dr. Brucchieri shall be subject to and permit unannounced inspections by a Board representative;
5. Dr. Brucchieri shall pay the costs of the Adjudication hearing in the amount of \$1909 payable to the Board within thirty days of the Order;
6. Dr. Brucchieri’s license to practice veterinary medicine shall be automatically suspended if it appears to the Board that Dr. Brucchieri has violated or breached any terms or conditions of the Order. Following the automatic suspension, the Board shall notify Dr. Brucchieri via certified mail of the specific nature of the charges and automatic suspension of his license. Upon receipt of the notice, Dr. Brucchieri may request a hearing regarding the charges.


