MEETING MINUTES March 12, 2014

1. Call to Order:

Dr. Cynthia Kidd, President of the Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board called the March 12, 2014 meeting to order at 8:32 a.m. in Room 1914, located at 77 South High Street, 19th Floor, Columbus, Ohio.

3. Acknowledge Staff, AAG & Guests:

Dr. Kidd acknowledged the attendance of Barry McKew, Assistant Attorney General, Theresa Stir, Executive Director, Joseph McClain, Licensure Coordinator taking board minutes and other guests in attendance.

4. January Minutes: Dr. Redman moved to approve the January 2014 board minutes as submitted. Mr. Brandt seconded the motion. The motion passed by the following roll call vote: Mr. Brandt – aye, Dr. Salinger – aye, Dr. Redman – aye, Ms. Jessen – abstain, Dr. Kolb - aye.

5. President's Report: None

6. Vice President's Report: Dr. Kolb commented how well the OVMA conference went and the success of the presentation given by the OVMLB.

7. Secretary's Report: None

8. OVMA Liaison: Jack Advent, Executive Director of the Ohio Veterinary Medical Association, thanked the Board their presentation at the OVMA conference and provided an update on pending legislation.

9. Executive Director Report:

- A. Directives – The January 2014 Board meeting directives were completed.
- B. Fiscal Reports – Ms. Stir provided revenue and expense totals for FY12 and FY 2013 in consideration of the anticipated budget for FY16-17. In lieu of raising licensure fees, the Board will seek more of the revenue that the Board brings in to cover the costs of increased investigations and compliance inspections.

Ms. Stir also proposed potential language changes to the Veterinary Medical Practice Act related to the budget regarding eliminating the need for Board approval for the NAVLE. As most states currently operate, the applicant applies directly to the NBVME to take the NAVLE and thus receives the scores directly and more quickly from NBVME. Additionally, the Board would like to accept PAVE as an alternative to the ECFVG and language was brought forward for review. After discussion and recommendations to the language, the Board approved submitting the proposed language changes during the budget process.

Ms. Stir reported that the Board's copier is currently out of service. The Board is utilizing a loaner. Ms. Stir obtained 3 bids from state contract vendors to compare with the State's cost per copy fees. The Board is going with the lowest bid and sought approval from a waiver from DAS.

Additionally, the State is migrating to the Office 365 system and there will be additional costs associated that were not anticipated when preparing the FY14 budget. The costs for the new e-licensing system are unknown but we are being told by DAS that the costs will be "at least 3 times greater than the current costs".

- C. Rules – The BIAs were approved by the Lt. Governor's office without any recommendation. Therefore, the proposed rules were filed with JCARR on March 4, 2014. The Public Rules hearing will be held at the April 9, 2014 board meeting.
- D. Annual Student Loan Report– The Board members were provided a copy of the mandatory report of the Veterinary Student Loan Repayment Program that is submitted to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate.
- E. Governor's Appointments – Dr. Roger Redman has been reappointed for another three year term. The Board's nomination for the AAVSB Board was submitted shortly thereafter to AAVSB. There remains an open veterinary position on the OVMLB.
- F. Board of Pharmacy Rule Proposal – The Ohio Board of Pharmacy sent a notice to all stakeholders regarding their proposal to classify tramadol as a Schedule IV controlled substance. The Board members expressed support of their proposal.

- G. Veterans Affairs – Ms. Stir provided an update regarding various proposals related to veterans that will result in the Board being required to promulgate a rule with their next rule review cycle.
- H. AAVSB – The AAVSB sent a notice to all membership boards regarding the request of the Nova Scotia Veterinary Medical Association to become a member board and has met the requirements of the AAVSB bylaws definition of a member board. The Board members did not have any objections.
- I. Updates – Ms. Stir provided the members an update of meetings and conference calls that the Board staff have participated in. The Board members requested a copy of the new Board Orientation Handbook to be sent to them via email.


