• Call to Order:

Dr. James Hearst, President of the Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board called the January 13, 2010 meeting to order at 8:31 a.m. in the Board room located at 77 South High Street, 31st Floor, Columbus, Ohio.

<u>Fiscal</u> - Ms. Stir provided the Board with Q2 FY10-11Revenue and Expense reports. As of 12/22/09, there was a balance of \$21,142.00 in the Student Veterinary Repayment Program Fund. There will be a transfer of \$20 to the fund as a result of the renewal of veterinarian licenses for the 2nd quarter.

She further explained to the Board that the operating budget is meeting the Board's needs thus far for online renewal expenditures. Ms. Stir anticipates that once the Farm Management Rule is approved, there will be enough funds to cover the costs of reprinting a small supply of new Law and Rules booklets for staff, board members, and those licensees who do not have access to a computer.

She asked the Board if an animal aide, while a veterinarian is in the room, can turn an anesthesia machine up or down. The Board said an animal aide can turn an anesthesia machine up or down at the direction of a veterinarian. However, an animal aide cannot induce the anesthesia. The Board further explained that under the supervision of a veterinarian a veterinary technician can induce the anesthesia, but an animal aide cannot. Dr. Schulze thanked the Board for their time and departed the meeting at 9:38 a.m.

The Board directed Ms. Stir to inform Ms. Grizer that the Medical Board referred the letter to the Veterinary Medical Board and recommend that she resend her inquiry related to the human medicine legislation to the Medical Board without mentioning the veterinary field.

Ms. Jessen moved to change the meeting minutes to read "member of family" rather than daughter. Dr. Gitz seconded the motion. - C. The Board reviewed correspondence from an anonymous writer asking why veterinarians must be licensed. The Board determined that this correspondence did not require a response.
- D. The Board reviewed correspondence from Sarah Shuleva regarding patient monitoring. Ms. Shuleva asked: Is it required by law to have an RVT documenting a patient's heart rate, respirations and 02% while under anesthesia during the entire length of a surgery? The Board answered: No.

• Old Business:

- A. Farm Management Rule Ms. Stir provided the Board with the OVMA drafted rule. She noted her concerns regarding the statement 'a veterinarian must train an animal owner' as conflicting with Section 4741.20(A) ORC. The Board agreed. After some discussion, the Board directed Ms. Stir to make their recommended revisions, send the draft to the Board for their review and then forward the proposed rule to the OVMA.
- B. **Student Loan Progress Reports** Ms. Stir provided the Board with the progress reports from the 2009 student loan recipients. The Board reviewed them with no comment.
